ADULT PSYCHIATRIC BEDS IN ORANGE COUNTY

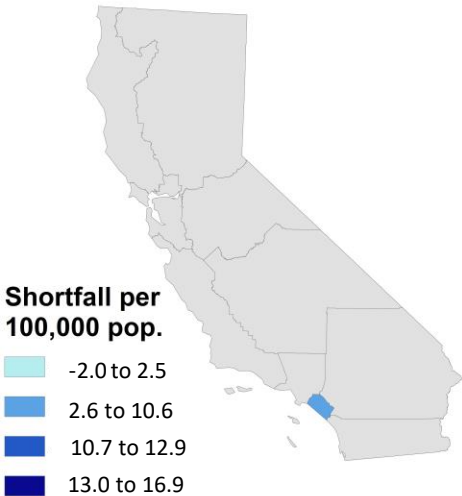
- Orange County has an acute psychiatric bed shortfall of 62 beds, or 2.5 beds per 100,000 adults.
- Orange County has a subacute psychiatric bed shortfall of 139 beds, or 5.6 beds per 100,000 adults.
- Orange County has a residential psychiatric bed shortfall of 244 beds, or 9.8 beds per 100,000 adults.

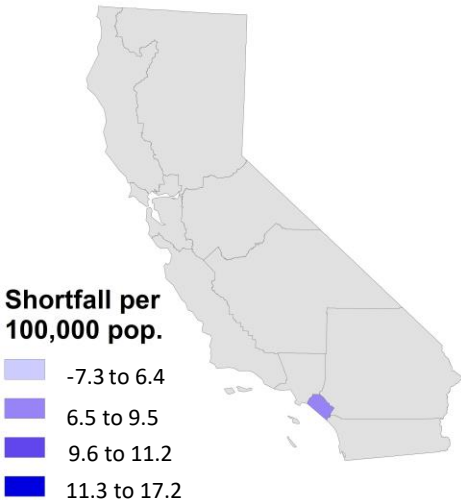
**Note: State hospital beds were not included in calculations of psychiatric bed capacity. Over 90% of state hospital beds are occupied by individuals who are incompetent to stand trial, a population with unique constraints that does not apply to the local behavioral health continuum. Exclusion of state hospitals has the secondary benefit of modeling need for psychiatric beds if state hospitals were transitioned to local, community-based alternatives.*
