ADULT PSYCHIATRIC BEDS IN SAN DIEGO COUNTY

- San Diego-Imperial has an acute psychiatric bed shortfall of 57 beds, or 2.1 beds per 100,000 adults.
- San Diego-Imperial has a subacute psychiatric bed shortfall of 268 beds, or 9.7 beds per 100,000 adults.
- San Diego-Imperial does not have a shortfall of residential psychiatric beds, though it is possible that a bottleneck could be created due to bed occupants from *outside* the region.

^{*}Note: State hospital beds were not included in calculations of psychiatric bed capacity. Over 90% of state hospital beds are occupied by individuals who are incompetent to stand trial, a population with unique constraints that does not apply to the local behavioral health continuum. Exclusion of state hospitals has the secondary benefit of modeling need for psychiatric beds if state hospitals were transitioned to local, community-based alternatives.
