ADULT PSYCHIATRIC BEDS IN SUPERIOR

- Superior does not have a shortfall of acute psychiatric beds, though it is possible that a bottleneck could be created due to additional bed occupants from outside the region.
- Superior has a subacute psychiatric bed shortfall of 401 beds, or 15.9 beds per 100,000 adults.
- Superior has a residential psychiatric bed shortfall of 69 beds, or 2.7 beds per 100,000 adults.
